<b>Course contents</b>	The course aims to develop students' ability to understand and use Italian legal terminology and to expand their communication and analytical skills. Lectures will focus on the peculiarities of Italian legal language, starting from the Civil Code. The course will be divided into three parts: lexicon, definitions and legal language.
<b>Teaching methods</b>	Lectures
<b>Reccomended or required readings</b>	The examination will be on the topics discussed in class and on the materials handed out. The reading of the book "Il linguaggio giuridico.

Prospettive interdisciplinari", a cura di G. Garzone e F. Santulli, Milano, Giuffrè, 2008, is optional. Particular attention will be given to D. Mantovani's essay on lexicon (pages 17-54), G. Garzone's essay on the language of regulation (pages 57-69), and finally to D. Antelmi's essay about definitions (pages 89-117).
