Course contents	Working areas: agriculture, handicraft, commerce. Leisure time: skows and game shows, theatrical performances and horse races, baths and bathing (leisure, hygiene and cosmetics). Eating behaviors. Family: marriage, children education, patria potestas.
Teaching methods	Lectures, with student's active contribution too, seminars and tutorial workshops.
Reccomended or required	1- Anthology of literary and epigraphical texts will be analyzed during

readings	lectures. 2- A deep study of two of the following handbooks: - A. Giardina (a cura di), L'uomo romano, Roma-Bari, Laterza, 2006 (riediz.) - L. Fezzi, Modelli politici di Roma antica, Roma, Carocci, 2015 - M. Beard, Prima del fuoco. Pompei. Storie di ogni giorno, Roma-Bari, Laterza, 2011 - F. Cenerini, La donna romana, Bologna, il Mulino, 2009 (II ed.). Students carrying on a personal research on an arranged topic are required to one only book within the ones quoted at point 2. For students not attending lessons is mandatory three handbooks.
