<b>Learning outcomes</b>	Aim of the course is investigating some problems of historical morphemics and syntax of Greek in order to approach the linguistic and formal characteristics of the ancient texts in a more conscious and analytic manner.
<b>Course contents</b>	<p>Title of the course: Morphology and lexicon: examples of archaic poetry and imperial prose.</p> <p>Program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Deep knowledge of the problems of morphemics, syntax and lexicon discussed during the lectures.</li><li>- Reading, translation and commentary of Lucian, "The dream or Lucian's life" and of some fragments of Archilochus, Sappho and</li></ul>

Alcaeus as well as a series of passages by various authors to illustrate the topics covered during the course, that will be distributed in photocopies during the lectures and then made available on the Kiro platform.

Provided that, for the specificity of the topics covered, frequency is highly recommended, not attending students should contact the lecturer in order to agree on a plan of alternative readings.

#### Teaching methods

Lectures with collegial discussion of some issues.

We suggest as useful reference books, respectively for Greek morphemics and syntax:

Further bibliography of reference to the texts we read will be recommended during the course.
