Course contents	Nominal paragraphs in the Indo-European languiages. Morphological and functional aspects, with special attention to cases.
Teaching methods	Lectures. The preparation of papers will be tutored individually (tutorato). Further course materials will be made available online on the platform http://luraghi.wikidot.com/ which will also contained updated information regarding course activities. Students will receive Username and password at the beginning of the course.

Assessment methods	Oral exam. During courses students will be asked to give short presentations concerning parts of the reading materials made available for the course.
