


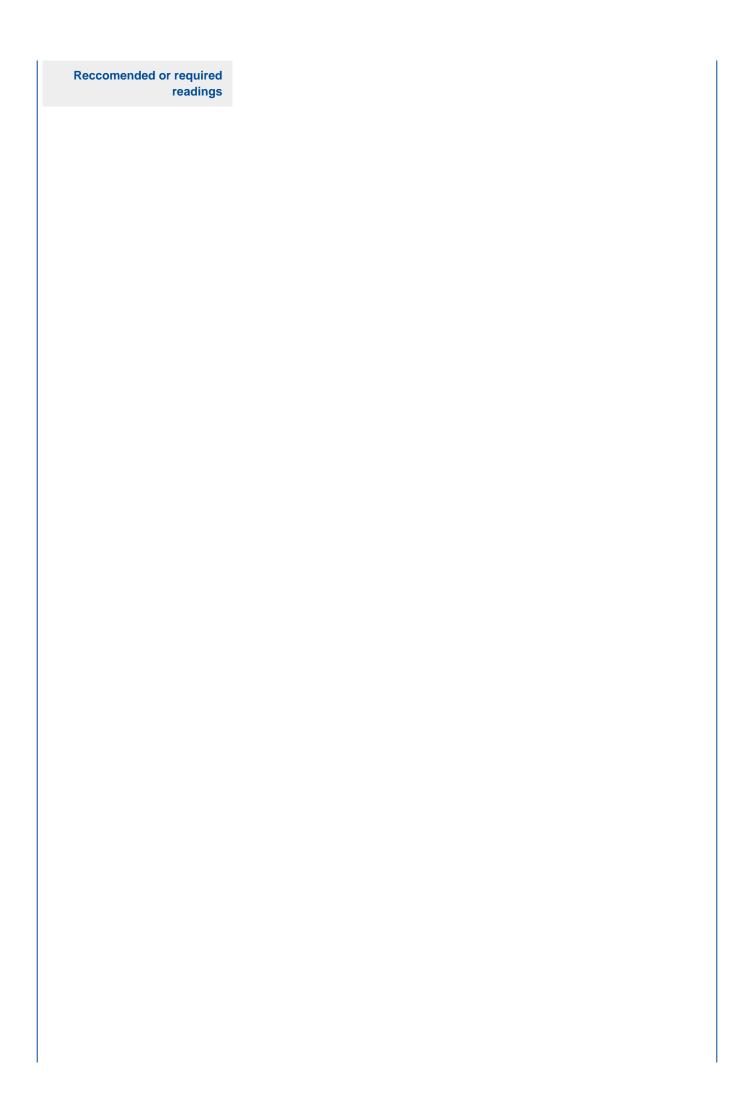

Course contents	The epigraphy of a meaningful city as Pompei. Study of selected			

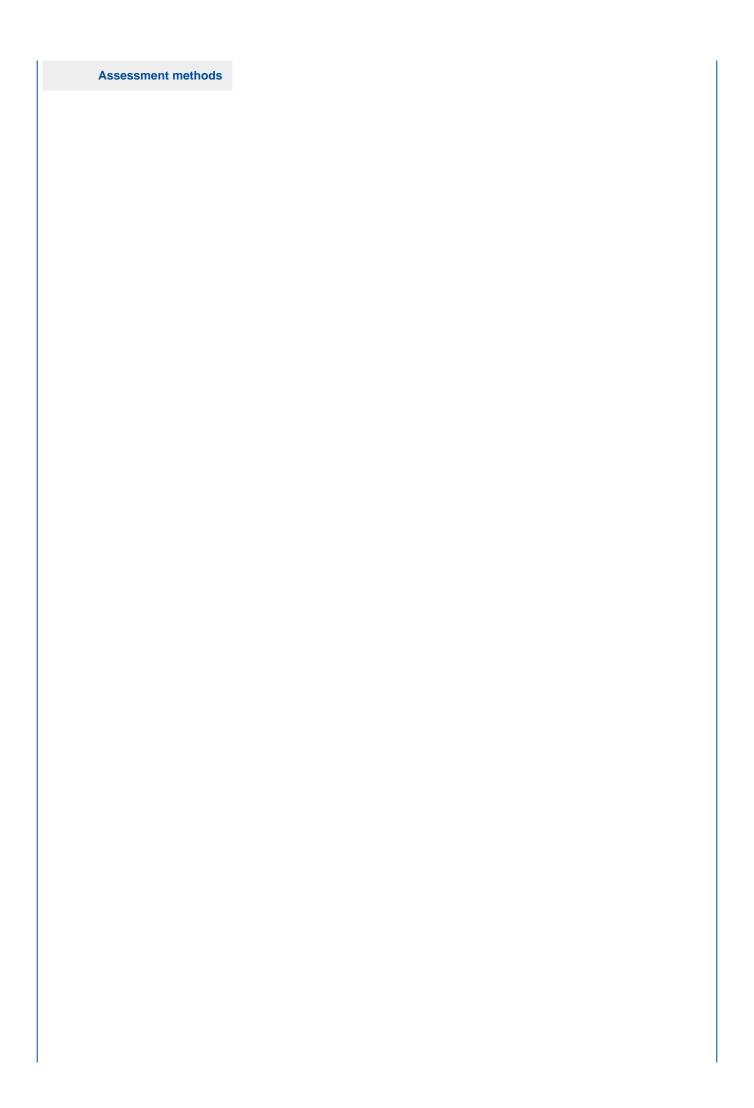

Family: marriage, children education, patria potestas.




Lectures, with student's active contribution too, seminars and tutorial workshops.


