Learning outcomes	The course introduces to the major theoretical issues and significant currents of philosophical thought from Kant to the present, through the study of selected texts and literature, and explores a theme, a text or an author of particular importance for the history of contemporary philosophy, through critical analysis of works, of methodological issues and of more meaningful interpretations.
Course contents	The materlialist conception of history The first part of the course will be devoted to illustrate the most important events and figures of the history of philosophy from Kant to Nietzsche. The second part of the course will deal monographically with the fundamental lines of Marx's and Engels' materialist conception of history
