Learning outcomes	<p>At the end of the second module the student will reach a intermediate language proficiency B2 (QCER), equivalent to HSK (Hanyu Shuiping Kaoshi) level 4.</p> <p>At the end of the course the student will be able to analyze and translate various types of written and oral texts.</p>
Course contents	The course aims at providing an intermediate/advanced language proficiency. More specifically, it focuses on the study of grammatical structures of intermediate - advanced level through listening, reading, and translation of different type of texts on current issues related to Chinese culture and contemporary society.
