Learning outcomes	At the end of the second module the student will reach a intermediate language proficiency B2 (QCER), equivalent to HSK (Hanyu Shuiping Kaoshi) level 4. At the end of the course the student will be able to analyze and translate various types of written and oral texts.
Course contents	The course aims at providing an intermediate/advanced language proficiency. More specifically, it focuses on the study of grammatical structures of intermediate - advanced level through listening, reading, and translation of different type of texts on current issues related to Chinese culture and contemporary society.

Teaching methods	Frontal lessons, Powerpoint presentation, reading Chinese newspapers in cooperative learning
